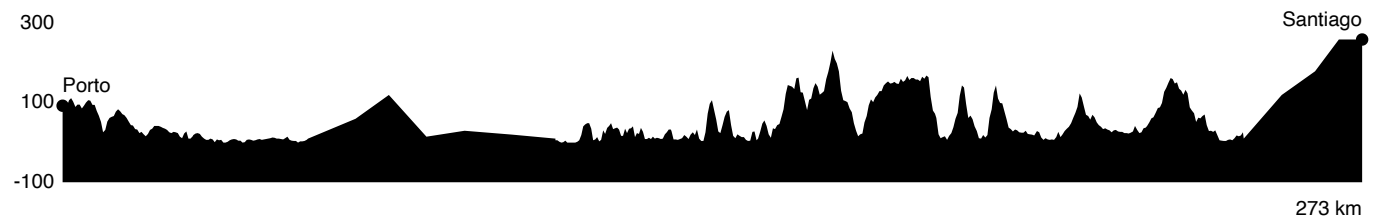


Camino Portugués Coastal

Porto → Santiago de Compostela · 12 stages · 273 km

The coastal Camino Portugués follows the Atlantic from Porto to Caminha, crosses the Minho by boat to A Guarda and hugs the Galician coast through Baiona and Vigo until it joins the central route at Redondela.

When to go

April to October. The north wind in summer is fresh; winter brings storms.

Getting to the start

Porto has an airport and trains. To start in Galicia, A Guarda and Baiona have buses from Vigo.

The Compostela and the last 100 km

From Baiona or A Guarda you exceed 100 km. Careful: from Vigo it is under 100.

The Caminha boat

The Minho crossing depends on the tide and the boatman's timetable; check the day before. Alternative: the Valença bridge on the central route.
