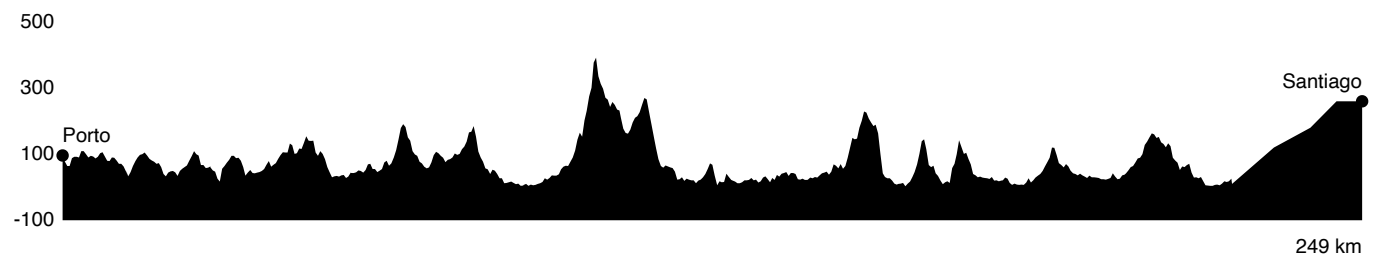


Camino Portugués

Porto → Santiago de Compostela · 11 stages · 249 km

The central Camino Portugués leaves Porto, climbs the Minho to Valença and crosses into Galicia at Tui. It is the second most walked route, with gentle stages and a good network of public albergues in Galicia.

When to go

March to October. Summers are warm but manageable; expect rain in spring and autumn in Galicia.

Getting to the start

Porto has an international airport and trains from Lisbon. Tui has trains from Vigo and buses from Porto and Vigo.

The Compostela and the last 100 km

Starting in Tui meets the 100 km rule. Stamp twice a day from Tui.

Budget

€30–40 a day in albergues; Xunta public albergues cost €10.
